General Pattern:

Last, First Middle. Title Underlined. City: Publisher, date.

Book: One Author:

Mueller, Gilbert. Nightmares and Visions. Athens: University of Georgia Press, 1972

Book: Two or Three Authors:

Robbins, Chandler S., Bertel Bruun, and Herbert S. Zirn. Birds of North America. Racine: Western Publishing, 1966.

Book with Editor: (textbook, anthology, or any edited works)

Stevenson, Victor, and Clive Unger-Hamilton, eds. The Music Makers. New York: Abrams, 1979.

Later Edition:

Van Baalen, Jan Karel. The Chaos of Cults. 4th ed. Grand Rapids: Wm. B. Eerdmans Publishing Co., 1969.

Corporate Author:

Insight team of the London Sunday Times. The Yom Kippur War. New York: Doubleday, 1974.

Encyclopedia: General Pattern:

Last. First (author if known). "Title." Encyclopedia Americana. 1980 ed.

Dictionary:

"Coliseum." American Heritage Dictionary. 2nd ed. 1982.

Newspaper:

Weise, Elizabeth. "It Makes for Lots of Speculation." USA Today. 15 Jan. 2001: ID.

General pattern for electronic texts of literary and historical documents:

Author(s). "Title of the article." Name of the book or complete work. Publication information (place, publisher, date for books, volume, and year of journal or magazine. Name of sponsoring institution. Date of YOUR access <complete URL>.

Remember to start your online citation with the first piece of information you have. If there is no author, move on to the title. If there is no publication information, move to the access date and URL.
